D.A. CARSON

Don is research professor of New Testament at Trinity Evangelical Divinity School, where he has been since 1978. He earned his M.Div from Central Baptist Seminary in Toronto and D.Phil from Cambridge. He is a member of the Tyndale Fellowship for Biblical Research and founded the Gospel Coalition. He has written or edited more than 45 books including *An Introduction to the New Testament* and *Becoming Conversant with the Emerging Church*.



COLIN SMITH

Colin is Senior Pastor of The Orchard Evangelical Free Church and President of Unlocking the Bible Ministries. Raised in Edinburgh, he trained at the London School of Theology where he earned his Bachelor of Theology and M.Phil degrees. He pastored the Enfield Evangelical Free Church in London for 16 years before coming to Arlington Heights. Colin is author of several books including the four volume series *Unlocking the Bible Story*.



DAVID HELM

David serves on the pastoral staff of Holy Trinity Church, a multi-congregational church in Chicago. He earned a BA from Wheaton College and an M.Div from Gordon-Conwell Theological Seminary and was later ordained in the PCA. He is author of *Preaching the Word: 1 & 2 Peter and Jude, The Big Picture Story Bible* and a contributor to *Preach the Word: Essays on Expository Preaching*. He also serves as the Chairman of the Charles Simeon Trust.
